# Remodeled Nurses' Station

"It's awesome. We love it!"

Kim Thompson, a charge nurse at Ohio Living Dorothy Love, expressed her delight with a remodeled nurses' station, one of two recent projects to benefit employees and make their work more efficient and enjoyable.

Centrally located between assisted living and the rehabilitation area, the area now has new paint, lighting, carpeting, cabinets and enough desk space for staff.

An anonymous donor, grateful to our employees, contributed \$40,000 toward the project.

# Modernized Employee Lounge

Donors also financed improvements to the employee lounge at Ohio Living Westminster-Thurber.

# Gateway to Good Living

Building renovations, endowment supported by campaign donors

Donors have once again stepped forward to make a special project come to life at an Ohio Living life plan community.

Through the Gateway to Good Living fundraising campaign, charitable gifts paid for extensive renovations to the first floor of Ohio Living Swan Creek's independent apartment building.

"From top to bottom, everything has been redone," said Nancy Hamilton, director of gift planning.

The lobby and reception area were overhauled with new flooring, wall coverings, lighting and furniture, as well as new lighting and interior windows for the dining room.

Restrooms have been modernized, elevator lobbies were upgraded, automatic doors were installed, offices have been updated and the Community Room was transformed into a new lounge/theater.

The focal point of the space is the new stone fireplace, which was funded through a

generous gift from resident John Morrison and his late wife, Nancy.

In addition to these renovations, this initiative also helped Ohio Living Swan Creek grow its endowment, permanently benefiting the campus, its residents and its programs.

Funds were raised in support of the Life Care Commitment and spiritual life. These endowment gifts are invested in perpetuity, and will provide lasting income for the life of the organization.

"This is really making a difference for residents, improving their quality of life, and that of staff and future residents as well," stated Nancy. •

# The Caring Fund

# Donors can now help employees in their time of need

Each of us, at one time or another, needs just a little help to get by when times get tough. But sometimes, we need more.

Ohio Living employees now have a place to turn during these times. The Ohio Living Foundation has established the Caring Fund to offer emergency financial assistance to employees experiencing catastrophic events through no fault of their own.

The **Hardship Assistance** program of the Caring Fund can provide up to \$5,000 of support per employee annually. A grant selection committee, comprised of three front-line employees

and two executive officers, reviews applications after all identifying information has been removed to ensure impartiality.

An emergency need can be practically anything that causes an unexpected financial hardship outside of the employee's control. Examples include a medical emergency, natural disaster, fire, death of an immediate family member, theft of property, vehicle accident, storm damages, violence/ domestic abuse and more.

The **Helping Hand** fund provides immediate financial assistance with small but urgent needs, up to \$500 annually. This

support is for employees experiencing immediate financial emergencies that threaten life, safety, or the ability to get to work (food, gas, utility shut-off, emergency car repair and more.)

The decision to provide support is at the discretion of the local executive director and/or human resources director; no application process is required. •




