It will reveal the secrets of unique neighborhoods, share Columbus' successes and remind us that with change come vices and problems.

Doreen Uhas Sauer holds degrees in history from The Ohio State University. Dr. Sauer earned statewide recognition for her work in preservation education. She was also named Ohio Teacher of the Year.

STAGING THE AFTERLIFE: **IMAGES OF HEAVEN AND HELL** IN RENAISSANCE DRAMA

Professor Elise Elonich Ryan returns to OWLS by popular demand! During the Reformation in England, following Henry VIII's split from the Roman Catholic Church and during the periods of religious upheaval, questions concerning the afterlife abounded: Would there be a bodily resurrection? Did Purgatory still exist? Could one be certain of salvation? Theologians and statesmen argued, and in some cases, died trying to answer these questions. Literature found other creative and dynamic ways to represent the personal and cultural crises causing seismic shifts in England. This class examines the ways that performance staged these questions of the afterlife creating one compelling and capacious means to understand one's life.

Professor Ryan earned a Ph.D. in English Renaissance Literature, has published articles, and teaches and writes in Pittsburgh, PA.

AGE OF DISINFORMATION: SOCIAL MEDIA AND "FAKE NEWS"

This Introduction to the Age of Disinformation will consist of four parts: (1) A characterization of the Age of Disinformation with a description of the variety of the forms of falsehoods that have entered the (dis)information marketplace, including

misinformation, disinformation, self-deception, doxing and fake news; (2) A description of the aims of deception from two viewpoints: the aims and kinds of deception, including self-deception, and the aims and kinds of misleading: (3) The psychological grounds for the adherents of fake news that makes them believe fake news and disbelieve contravening evidence or facts; (4) some lessons in information literacy to combat fake news stories and web sites.

Thomas J. Froehlich. Ph.D., is Professor Emeritus. School of Information, Kent State University (27 years). He has provided workshops and presentations in 26 countries in the areas of online searching and the ethical concerns of information professionals.

U.S. FOREIGN POLICY: 1970-2018: IMPLICATIONS AND **WORLD IMPACT**

Would you be surprised if Israel attacks Iran and what will be the consequences of an attack on the U.S.? Do you feel informed when discussing the current war in Afghanistan? Dr. Ferro will explore the common denominators of U.S foreign policy since 1970. The course will show the tension of U.S. national interests and their symmetry around the world. This class will deepen your understanding so you can see the similarities and differences in wars like Afghanistan and the Vietnam War. We can honor the more than 8,000 U.S. service people killed in the battles of Iraq and Afghanistan by learning about U.S. foreign policy in the past and present.

AMERICA'S "GILDED AGES": HISTORY AND CHARACTER-ARE WE THERE AGAIN?

"Gilded Age" describes a period of massive political corruption, especially politicians on the take courtesy of big business, and a society obsessed with money and getting rich. The first was the "roaring" 1920s. Since then until today, new "gilded ages," have marked periods of political corruption, the corporate power exercised against the public interest, and economic inequality. Has the "gilded age" label

ever been applied fairly or accurately? Was the original label more an exercise in nostalgia and political rationalization than a description of an especially corrupt period? Were later "gilded ages" exceptionally corrupt periods? Is today historically "gilded"?

Dr. Baker received her Ph.D. from Rutgers University, where she studied U.S. political and women's history. She is currently completing a history of campaign finance, The American Political Industry, which tells the story of party finance and organization from the beginning of mass political parties to 2004.


October 16, 2018 1 PM to 3 PM

Dr. Karen Eliot, author of Albion's Dance: British Ballet during the Second World War, published by Oxford University Press examines personal stories drawn from memories and writings with the historical context of the time.
